A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

"On September 22, 2021, Stephen Colbert and six other late-night TV hosts featured climate change in their programs. Among other things, Colbert admitted, 'I'm a great hypocrite. I'll never do anything that's inconvenient for me. That's why there has to be systemic change, to make the right choices, not the easy ones.' "That's how Sisters of St. Joseph's Mary McGlone begins her take on this Sunday's scriptures for the second week in the Season of Creation.

I've often struggled to get the right words for the climate emergency we face since Pope Francis began his own campaign in 2015 to save the poor *et al living* on our planet from the ravages of climate change. It is, in fact, the greatest pro life campaign humanity has ever waged- or not- since life arose from all the once inert matter of creation, brought into being by the Spirit whereby God would pronounce all things good.

McGlone also sees Ezekiel as the watchman God anointed for Israel- not guarding so much as disturbing those he would save from their own ignorance, indifference or malice. "Ezekiel's only option is to do like the comedians and warn folks that their behavior is pressing down the accelerator on their impending doom." McGlone also goes on to see Jesus reflecting on his own prophetic calling and figuring how to pull it off with memorable humor and the sort of hyperbole on fraternal correction we find in today's gospel.

Ultimately Jesus is not talking about punishment as much as a change of heart for those in need of correction. After all attempts have gone for naught, the only option is for the living community to accept the values they must embrace and pursue whether the estranged have that change of heart or not.


