A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Both Jeremiah and Peter had a right to complain to our Lord. That is allowable since God often does seduce us with the truth as only God can do. Then we fully experience the cost of that truth as we choose to live it out. Ezekiel said God's word can taste like honey in the mouth but bitter to the stomach. Peter's exuberant proclamation of Jesus as the Messiah must have turned in his stomach as Jesus rebukes him for protesting the suffering the Messiah will endure in Jerusalem.

As Paul tells us in the second reading this Sunday, "do not conform yourselves to this age" while digesting God's will for you- whether in your prophetic calling or the sacrifices you will endure as Jesus' follower. Like Peter, we will undoubtedly be tempted to fashion God's will according to our own terms instead of falling in behind what ultimately will prove "good and pleasing and perfect."

These past two week's gospels come at a time in which the Diocese of Lexington asks each and every parishioner to contribute to its Annual Appeal. I often hear the response to DAA in the form of a question: what is in it for our parish? DAA funding goes to the poorer parishes in Eastern Kentucky, to deacon and seminarian training, to youth or prison ministries, and even for rebates to the parishes for reaching certain financial and participation goals. But are we feeling just a bit "seduced" by the truth of what our Diocese needs to make us all good, pleasing and perfect?
