## A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

In today's scripture, from Exodus's call for charity and care for the alien to Jesus' pairing our love of God with love of neighbor and, implicitly, even our enemies, we are challenged to right relationships with all those other than ourselves. There are myriad ways in which power, greed, selfishness and indifference have warred against these sacred precepts and no nation, religion or people can claim a stainless history in this regard. Thankfully we have a loving and merciful God whose Son has made it possible for us to start anew each and every waking moment and to move toward right relationships with all whom we encounter.

With the Synod in Rome concluding this week, we seek a Church in which it will be easier to love and be in good relationships with all our neighbors, even if our neighbors or fellow parishioners look, act and think differently than we do. Admittedly it has not been easy in the past to be or remain in such relationships but we can pray that the Holy Spirit will give us the right words to say and the right ways to act when we are tempted to do otherwise.

In that regard, we can use the DAA as a personal test for those of us who have yet to make a contribution that goes- not to ourselves or our parish but- to the very neediest of our neighbors in our Diocese. The causes of their neediness vary from natural disasters to the physical, social and spiritual needs that typify the sort of poverty that plagues 40 of our 59 parishes. We are fortunate to be members of a parish that can meet its payroll and operational expenses. Yet most of those 40 parishes reside in Eastern Kentucky, among the poorest areas of our country where less than 1 percent of the people the DAA serves are Catholic. How's that for being neighborly?!
