A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

The money referred to in today's gospel, talents, were no mere pittance. Each was worth twenty years' wages. Interestingly, the third servant was aware of their value and chose to hang onto it for fear of losing it in any daring venture that might prove to be a rewarding investment- even one far surpassing its significant value. But the servant's fear of that loss mirrored the servant's fear of his master whom he knew to be a "demanding" person. The other servants, however, were wise enough to recognize that their master took significant risks himself, risking the growth of his wealth to those who might squander it or, like the third servant, leave it dormant buried in the ground.

Various exegesis of the gospel cite wonderful examples of people of diverse talents who were given physical and/or spiritual gifts by their Creator. They saw in them not only an opportunity for growing the Kingdom here on earth but also had the courage to trust ultimately in the love of their Creator and their calling to receive and share the Creator's love and gifts among their brothers and sisters. Let us ask ourselves, with the spirit of thanksgiving we will be celebrating in the coming week, to embrace the love of the Creator who has gifted us so generously and to respond likewise to our Christian calling to serve others- even at the risk of failing. Indeed, as Tennyson wrote, "it is better to have loved and lost than never to have loved at all."
