A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

As Sr. Mary McGlone points out in her exegesis of our scripture today, "how many times have you heard St. Paul bashed for what he says about women." Then she alludes to today's letter from Paul, sandwiched between two readings that berate religious leaders for failing their vocation in which he honors- and points out in a way that his predominantly gentile audience would understand- an image of what a nursing mother does for her child. Sr. Mary goes on to further explain the care with which the religious leaders should profess the faith, namely, by sharing, with gentleness and utmost care, a part of themselves with their flock just as a loving mother does so with her beloved child.

But beyond this better understanding of Paul's empathy for women, there are, admittedly, readings from Paul which still would raise some feminine eyebrows such as the idea, even though taken out of "context", that women should be "subservient" to men- a concept that certainly does little to carry the idea of all people being equal in the eyes of a God who loves, without favoritism, all his children. There are better translations, scripture scholars will tell you, than the word "subservient" which probably reflected the culture of the translator as much as the culture in which Paul preached. And by "context", I refer to the cultures of all ages which inevitably reflect the world in which the word of God comes to be understood. A good example of cultural influence is the way in which the culture of today better reflects the truth of God's word than when Paul wrote of his loving entreaty on behalf of the slave Onesimus.

As readers of scripture as well as hearers of scripture, we must always be cognizant of the dangers of literalism and fundamentalism. That's why scriptural as well as theological studies are an evolving and Spirit-led practice and not a once-and-done proposition.
