A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

All of us can remember various portrayals of Matthew's story of the "Three Kings" of Epiphany with names and other details not recounted in the scripture but gaining a foothold in our minds nevertheless - through the inventions of non-scriptural media. Even when such details are in scripture, we have to remember that Matthew was writing to educate and inspire but not as a historian. Matthew's account of the Epiphany clearly shows us the irony- disappointing as well as delightful- of the event as these travelers from the East, pagans- not Jewish, are not the seekers one would expect from the Jewish faithful long awaiting the Messiah.

Matthew structured his Gospel so that everything would illuminate Jesus's last command and final promise. After telling the disciples to spread the Gospel throughout the whole world, he promised, "behold, I am with you, until the end of the age." The Holy Family has been the chief protagonists for all three masses of the Christmas Octave. Yet in the Epiphany that follows, Matthew exhibits more interest in the star than in the Holy Family. The star, a symbol visible to the whole world, proclaimed that an extraordinary event has taken place. Who paid attention? Pagans, not the religious leaders and their scripture scholars but people who read the signs of the times and had enough humility and courageous curiosity to venture beyond their certainties.

Jesus' enemies are convinced that they have the whole truth and that Jesus is a heretic or worse. To God's grief, their certainty blinded them to the natural wonder of the star and the wisdom of their scriptures. In today's feast, in addition to singing "We three Kings," we might imitate the humble and courageously curious with the simple mantra: "I wonder as I wander out under the sky." Ironically, wandering wonder is the recipe for being open to epiphany.
