# A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

When we're seeking our vocation or an extension of what we believe God has called us to do, it is always helpful to continually listen to the deepest part of our heart where God's love is ever indwelling. In today's first reading and Gospel we find an example of four individuals whose collective vocations were, you could say, works in progress. All four are "prayerdreamers" or people who allowed daydreams to lead them to God's will in their lives.

The term "prayerdreamer" is a term Jesuit Fr. Mark Thibodeaux used to describe the founder of the Jesuit order, St. Ignatius Loyola. He said that Ignatius learned that God communicates the divine will through great desires for faith, hope and love that welled up inside his heart and soul. By daydreaming in the context of prayer, Ignatius was able to allow those great desires to surface. Doing so would fire him up to have the necessary passion to perform those great works for which Ignatius and the heroes in our scripture today are known.

Notably you could argue that the lives of those in our scripture today as well as Ignatius were heading in a direction seemingly dissonant from its original trajectory. Even John the Baptist admitted by sending his disciples to Jesus while in jail that he had his uncertainties about the One he called the Lamb of God; as did Samuel thinking Ely had called him and as did the Apostles when Jesus predicted his death and resurrection. three times. Vocations rarely come without doubts. But ultimately, through prayerful dreaming, our vocations become convictions when we are able to reach beyond apparent certainty to a passion for that deepest part of ourselves that hungers, as Augustine said, for something only God can give.
