A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

This weekend's gospel is set in the darkness of night as Jesus explains to Nicodemus how he, as well as we, discern the truth that leads us to God among the darkness that would lead us away from God. Light and darkness are important themes of our faith. "Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God." Cardinal McElroy of San Diego has exhorted us and our fellow Catholics of all ages to be schooled in the art of discerning the light, or the truths of our faith, amid the context of the lies and disinformation that permeates much of our social media today This coming Wednesday, at 6pm in the Church Hall at St Joseph's, Fr Bob Dueweke will be speaking on the Second Vatican Council and its importance to our faith. Indeed Vatican II is part of the teachings of our faith even as Pope Francis is in the process of implementing those truths some 60 years after the Council concluded- and, against the disinformation that exists in our world today.

Before or after you hear what Fr. Bob has to say, you can begin your own prayerful process of discerning the truths of our faith with guidance from speakers of our faith who have the imprimatur of our Bishop and/or our Pope, such as Fr. Bob. And you can do that by prayerful listening and asking questions from speakers such as Bob- who is well known for encouraging people to ask questions when they don't understand what they hear, or read, from him or another authorized teacher. And, most certainly, they should question if they have heard something which contradicts what they have heard from an authority of the Church. Fr Bob also facilitates discussions and questioning in his presentations, just as he will at the Church this coming Wednesday. Another way to sharpen our discernment skills is to take the time to invest ourselves in the prayerful models of our faith such as The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit Order. The Exercises are a series of prayers and meditations that are often given at retreats. But reading them would be a good way to prepare for such a retreat. Parishioners of St. Patrick's are also invited to Fr. Bob's presentation but please notify Ms. Kathie Schweikart, 859 -808-1269, to coordinate seating plans. Thanks Fr. Jim



Norms of the Church for Lenten Penance

FAST - Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to fast. ABSTINENCE - The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age or older. If members of the Faithful are unable to observe the fast and abstinence regulations because of ill health or other reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of penance and self-denial suitable to their condition.
