## A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

During my recent vacation I heard a story on the golf course which reminded me of today's gospel. The wry story told of another golf outing and how a golfer was complaining to his playmates that his game is going very poorly while his fellow golfer recognizes that his game is no better or worse than it usually is. His fellow golfer recommends to his complaining companion that he needs to lower his expectations. Much the same recommendation applies to James and John as well as the other apostles who have heard for the third time about Jesus being handed over, mocked, scourged and condemned to death.

It is a common temptation for all of us to feel we have done enough to merit a reward for our labors that belies the realities of the life into which God has called us. Jesus' response is to question the expectations of the apostles and whether they- and we- are willing to drink the cup of which Jesus partakes. That meaning is clear in the Gethsemane scene where Jesus begs God to let the cup pass him by if possible. Likewise, baptism here signifies being plunged into suffering and going through the throes of death, to emerge into new life.

Like the complaining golfer, James and John exude astounding confidence in their abilities to do what Jesus asks- not really knowing what they are saying. Perhaps we do the same when we say yes to the demands of dedicating ourselves to Jesus' way of costly love. Jesus takes the disciples another step deeper. The reward for which they hope beyond this life is not within Jesus' control to give, and it must not be their motivation- and certainly not for displays of greatness and authority over others. The only "throne" that he shares with his disciples is "the throne of grace" (Heb 4:16). *Blessing, Fr. Jim*

**Forming Consciences For Faithful Citizenship WEEK FIVE: Solidarity**  
 Solidarity is "a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to . . . the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all."<sup>1</sup> We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. The person is social in nature; we develop and flourish within a community. As baptized members of the community of the Church, we are part of one body in Christ and we are also part of one global human family.<sup>2</sup> In Fratelli Tutti (On Fraternity and Social Friendship) Pope Francis places solidarity at the center of what it means to cultivate social friendship as one family: *Solidarity Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community. It means that the lives of all are prior to the appropriation of goods by a few. It also means combatting the structural causes of poverty, inequality, the lack of work, land, and housing, the denial of social and labor rights.* Thus, solidarity affects not only the goals we pursue in public life, but also the way we pursue them—ever mindful that we are all brothers and sisters, all children of God.....
