A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

If you can remember a time when you were exceedingly hungry and then broke your fast with food that you had never had before- such as in your youth, you can then realize what the feedings in our scriptures today meant to the hundred or the five thousand who enjoyed their miraculous meals.

Of course many of us in the West no longer think of our meals as miraculous, well fed as most of us are. Yet one sixth of the planet's population suffers from severe hunger. Not surprisingly the hardest hit are those who live in the developing nations of our world: hundreds of millions of people are starving in Asia and Africa. But developing countries are not immune: millions go wanting in the richest countries of the world.

Today's readings are both challenging and comforting in light of the food crisis. The readings tell of the feeding of hungry crowds by Elisha and Jesus. This is a story that obviously foreshadows the Eucharist and it is also a story about finding abundance where scarcity seems to reign. A common take on this story is that food was there all along, but the crowd refused to share out of fear that it would not be enough. Only when they saw the boy's generosity were others inspired to share until there was more than enough. Averages can be misleading especially when 20 percent of the population consumes 80 percent of all world commodities. That may explain why Americans, on the whole, consume eight times what the average world citizen consumes even when millions of Americans adhere to modest consumption habits or less.

HISTORY OF OUR ST. JOSEPH CHURCH (1992)...

FORMER PASTORS OF ST. JOSEPH.....Father Edward Healy: 1887-1892; Father Thomas Major: 1892-1895; Father William Ryan: 1895-1909; Msgr. Herbert Hillenmeyer: 1909-1915; Msgr. George O' Bryan: 1915-1928; Father Henry Schulte: 1928-1946; Father William O'Hare: 1946-1947; Fr. John Danz: 1947-1958; Father Theodore Keller: 1958-1968; Msgr. John Danz: 1968-1970; Father Francis Campbell: 1970-1971; Father Paul Wethington: 1971-1972; Father George Nerbonne: 1972- 1981; Father Robert Nieberding: 1981-1987; Father Joseph Saulino: 1987-

The Church (Mission) was established in 1872. A large celebration was held in 1972, marking that 100 years. A parish celebration, marking the 100 years of establishment of St. Joseph as a parish was celebrated on Sunday, November 22, 1987.

Priest to follow this History were Ken Weibel, Father Norman Fisher, Father Jacob Kurian, Father Frank Brawner and Currently Father James Kinney.
