A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

In the ancient culture of Jesus' milieu, peoples' primary identification was found among their family and their compatriots. In today's culture- particularly in the U.S.- there is an obsession, an addiction to individualism and independence. It manifests itself consciously or unconsciously in people who proclaim alternate realities and refuse to accede to the facts or the proven findings of science. It is as if Friedrich Nietzsche's call for a "will to power" has finally found its way into a mindset that defies common sense and sanity. Being the very body of Christ compels us to choose who and what we are- and what we are becoming.

That is not to say that life can not be so complex as to defy easy solutions or ready answers to the plights and the difficulties people can face. Such is the case in John's "bread of life" discourse in which we find Jesus leading his disciples over the past month's gospels from their ready acceptance of his miraculous feeding of the five thousand to deeper and more profound understandings of his identity and the very depths of the Divine presence and reality in our lives. That is why Jesus, in the prelude to his ascent into heaven, prepared us for the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide us through the complexities of life.

As he leads us in today's gospel, Jesus knows that the "saying is hard' and shocking, as he himself recognizes. It includes a mysterious element of gift that is inexplicable, like the fact that we can never fully or logically explain why we choose to spend our whole life with another when such a commitment is bound to entail great difficulties. Love and the gracious gift of God are often all that we can offer to explain such a choice.
