A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

It always amazes me how our common understanding of miracles requires something supernatural when God or Jesus often did the miraculous through things that were perfectly natural. Take for instance our first reading today in which Moses speaks to his hard necked followers who complained about their longing for the fleshpots and bread of Egypt despite the bitter imprisonment they suffered while in that land. The manna that fell from heaven can, in fact, be a natural mealybug or lichen accumulation on the desert floor that can be made into bread as are the quail which, exhausted from their nightly northward migration over the Mediterranean, are an easy prey for those who would gather them up on the desert floor.

Yet we must remember that neither the Israelites nor Moses himself would have had such scientific information at their beck and call when faced with their rebellion. We never think twice about the natural world as miraculous even though it was created by God from nothing and continues to baffle modern scientists with its dark holes, supernovas and evolutionary reality- not too many decades ago, a much disputed contradiction to biblical understanding

As we continue to venture into John's "Bread of Life Discourse", Jesus continues to challenge his audiences with wild, radical- even horrifying- claims that seem perfectly acceptable to those of us with two thousand years of Christian history and a well-developed sacramental theology under our belts. In addition to the claim that cannibalism is suddenly okay, Jesus' "I am" statement would be seen as patently blasphemous to his audience two millennia ago. Do we not continue to grasp at the realities of our faith, like the grumbling Israelites and Jesus' understandably shocked followers, when the Pope and our Bishop continue to press our ever evolving understandings of the Spirit incarnate in our material world.
