A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

The vulnerability of God's son born in a barn and under threat of a corrupt despot seeking Jesus' death was made apparent to us during the recent Christmas season. That threat was accomplished some 33 years after birth when our Lord and savior was crucified. Today's gospel reminds us again of that vulnerability only 40 days after Jesus' birth when Simeon speaks of the sword that will pierce the heart of Jesus' mother Mary. Alternatively, we might expect God to be made apparent in glory as today's psalm describes. Yet when Christ reveals himself to us, whether in word, in sacrament, or in the face of another human being, will we recognize him?

In today's world, Malachi might ask us when we see or hear of those made vulnerable by the despots of greed and power, "who will endure the day of his coming?" Will we choose to follow Jesus or will we walk away? Will we "rise" with Christ or will we "fall" into sin? As Malachi describes with the images of fire and lye, God desires to purify us, to cleanse us of all defect or blemish, so that we can "stand when he appears."

As Mary was pierced, so might we also, like her, persevere in faith. Importantly, standing with God is not something that God asks us to do by ourselves. God's very relationship with us, as with Israel, is one of abiding presence. Like Mary and Joseph presenting their first born to God, we give what we have for the service of God, trusting that God will do the rest. Like their gift to God, we offer what we have been given. If we trust in God's Providence for each of us, then God will provide the grace to mold our hearts in his image.
