A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Perhaps Luke's Sermon on the Plain is not as palatable to those who live comfortable lives as Mathew's Sermon on the Mount because it addresses the listener directly instead of in the third person. It's also easier not to deal with woes, all absent from Mathew's version, than the four which Luke's version includes. Luke's sharp contrast between four blessings and four woes also makes it very clear that the kingdom of God presents us with choices, and these choices carry consequences.

The beatitudes and woes in the Gospel of Luke are not about assigning guilt; instead the blessings and laments uphold the necessity of living in right relationship with God and within our faith communities. To prioritize wealth while others are poor, to be over indulgent when others go hungry, to laugh in the midst of mourning, to seek the approval of peers while others are persecuted - all these point to a disconnect within the community of faith, global as well as local.

Whereas Matthew situates his version of this address on a mountain crowded with people from all over, Luke tells us that the great crowd Jesus addressed consisted of only "disciples." That sets a different tone, making this not a general teaching but a direct address to those who would be his followers. This makes it even clearer that the choices given are inescapably ours to make, along with real consequences for our choices.

Norms of the Church for Lenten Penance

FAST - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to fast.
ABSTINENCE - The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age or older. If members of the Faithful are unable to observe the fast and abstinence regulations because of ill health or other reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of penance and self-denial suitable to their condition.
