A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

On this day, known as Good Shepherd Sunday, much has been made of the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Being a sheep in Christ's fold involves: hearing his voice, being known by him and following him. There is a relational exchange involved in each of these: he calls, we listen; he knows us, we know him; he leads, we follow. His attentive love flows from the love of the Father who made us and gave us to Jesus' care. And his love sustains us, providing not just for the immediate needs of this life but for our ultimate aim of eternal life with him, Similarly, Israel's vocation was to recognize the Messiah by heeding the words and warnings of their prophets, by rejecting idolatry and by worshiping the one true God.

In our first reading from Acts, we have at first a welcoming of the proclamation of Jesus as Messiah by the Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism. Then those jealous of the crowds following Paul and Barnabas contradicted what Paul proclaimed and turned many from enthusiasm to coldness. But not so the Gentiles who heard Paul proclaim them as the new and very enthusiastic followers of the Good Shepherd.

For us who were meant to be Jesus' "sheep," today's first reading can be an examination of conscience for us. We are called to know him and follow him. Do we recognize Jesus and listen to him? Or we like those in Acts who, filled with jealousy, were deaf to the Good News as it was proclaimed in their midst. Likely we are both. We have moments when we can hear, and moments when distractions, struggles, busy schedules, pride or any number of things deafen us to our Shepherd's voice. Let us have the humility to seek and find him on his terms and not our own.
