A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Two weeks ago we celebrated Pentecost, remembering that God remains with us in the gift of the Holy Spirit. This week, we remember another way in which God remains with us—in the Eucharist, where Jesus's very body and blood are really present. In the gospel chosen for this feast we have a moment from earlier in Jesus life which foreshadows the Eucharist. In it, Jesus follows the same "take, bless, break and give" pattern that he will follow at the Last Supper and that we will continue to follow at every mass.

In this pattern all those present find their fill, and God's superabundance assures there is much more food than what the gathered people needed. In the second reading, Paul recalls Jesus words at the Last Supper. We repeat these words at every mass, remembering Jesus even as he continues to be present to us.

The first reading makes another connection; Melchizedek offers bread and wine as he blesses Abram. Through all the readings, God feeds and nourishes God's people, providing for their needs and also providing abundantly, above and beyond what they could need.
