#### A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Peter and Paul were leaders of the early Church, granted authority to shape that Church and what it would become. But as we would hear in the first and second readings, they also suffered greatly. Their lives were not glamorous. Their love for Christ made them willing to endure a great deal of pain in service of him. Are we willing to let an encounter with Jesus transform our own lives, as it did with both Peter and Paul?

Central to today's gospel reading is the question from Jesus, "Who do you say that I am?" How would we answer the same question? Maybe we'd respond like the "some" referenced by the apostles---Jesus is a nice quy, a good moral teacher, someone who tells us all to get along. Alternatively, maybe we'd repeat something formulaic from the Catechism or a theology textbook----Jesus is the Second person of the Trinity, two natures in one person, and so on. Peter finds that Jesus is not satisfied with such an answer from others. Jesus probes further---who am I to you? Peter knows his response: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." A bold claim and one that will have consequences for the rest of his life.

Who would have guessed that a Galilean fisherman and a Pharisee from Tarsus could change the course of world history? Together, these great saints root the Church firmly in the city of Rome---both ministered and were killed there---and are inseparable as leaders in the early Church. They are also demonstrable proof that God qualifies the called rather than the other way around. Neither were perfect, Peter for his denying Christ three times and Paul depicted as "trying to destroy the Church." May we "taste and see" God's goodness to overcome our own failures.
