A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

By now most of us know the story of the good Samaritan by heart but we rarely if ever have heard of it from the standpoint of listening. The art of listening is directly related to our ability to recognize the word of God and carry it out. In this famous parable, the Samaritan is not looking to prove himself or demonstrate heroic virtue. But in the midst of his own travels, he listens to the promptings of the voice of God to be the hands of mercy for this man in need. He expresses more than just a willingness to be interrupted; he acknowledges this man's inherent dignity over and above any stigmas, categories, labels or expectations. His active listening allows the word of God to take root in his heart, and he demonstrates his reception to it through his acts of charity.

Listening to God's voice in prayer involves a willingness to be led and interrupted. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, God's Word transcends the capacity of our minds and leads us to think differently about our relationships with one another. It grounds us in our own belovedness so that we can recognize the belovedness of those around us, giving us the freedom to receive, to welcome, and to accept.

As you have heard me mention in recent homilies, in the weeks to come our parish council members will be engaging each parishioner in brief, one-on-one conversations in which you as well as councilors will be listening to hear how the Holy Spirit is calling our parish to mission. Until those one-on-one conversations take place, all of us-council members, parishioners and I- are asked to take the time to invoke the Holy Spirit in prayer, to hear how God is calling us to respond to the deepest needs of the parish, the neighborhood and the world as the Gospel demands.

Saint of the Day: Saint Henry II July 13
Son of Gisella of Burgundy and Henry II the
Quarrelsome, Duke of Bavaria. Educated at the
cathedral school in Hildesheim by bishop Wolfgang of
Regensburg. Became Duke of Bavaria in 995 upon
his father's death, and ended thoughts of becoming
a priest. Ascended to the throne of Germany in 1002.
Crowned King of Pavia, Italy on 15 May 1004.
Married St. Cunegunda, but was never a father.

Sources claim the two lived celibately, but no evidence.. Henry was crowned Holy Roman Emperor in 1014 By Pope Benedict VIII; last of the Saxon dynasty of emperors. Founded schools, quelled rebellions, protected the frontiers, worked to establish a stable peace in Europe, and to reform the Church while respecting its independence. Established Bamburg, Germany as a center for missions to Slavic countries. Started the construction of the cathedral at Basel, Switzerland; it took nearly 400 years to complete. Both Henry and St. Cunegunda were prayerful and generous to the poor. *Born* 6 May 972 at Albach, Hildesheim, Bavaria, Germany *Died* 13 July 1024 at Pfalz Grona, near Göttingen, Saxony (modern Germany) of natural causes *Canonized* 1146 by Pope Blessed Eugene III

Pause and Pray:

The Gift of Faith... Reflect Faith is one of the gifts of the Spirit. We cannot give ourselves faith. We can't make someone else have faith. Only by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit can we truly have faith. Pray Christ, by your death and resurrection, you have conquered all. By my baptism, I was born into the life of the Spirit. Fan the flame of your Sprit in me now; enliven my faith that I may know you evermore and proclaim you by my life. Amen. Act If you're discouraged, don't forget to ask God for what you need. Pray to have God increase your faith today.

Embrace Death

For us, as human beings, death is dark and scary and real. Even though we believe and trust in God, death can cause anxiety and anguish. Jesus does not bring us deliverance from death but deliverance through death. We live in a culture which, in many ways, is death-denying; it is afraid to take a clear look at the fact and the meaning of mortality. The cry of the psalmist is a profoundly human cry. Perhaps it is a witness our society could benefit from hearing. We also need to realize that Jesus suffered and died because of his fidelity to God's will in his life. Jesus' preaching was good news for the poor; he ate with publicans and sinners. Many, including both political and religious leaders, found this offensive and threatening. If we show fidelity to the teaching of Jesus, we can face similar reactions. We may not face actual death. But we can face opposition and mockery in lesser, more subtle ways that are still painful. "All who see me mock at me; they shake their heads" (Psalm 22:7). Do we continue to trust in the Lord?

En este momento, la mayoría de nosotros conocemos la historia del buen samaritano de memoria, pero rara vez lo hemos oído hablar de ella desde el punto de vista de la escucha. El arte de escuchar está directamente relacionado con nuestra capacidad de reconocer la Palabra de Dios y llevarlo a cabo. En esta famosa parábola, el samaritano no busca demostrar su valía ni demostrar una virtud heroica. Pero en medio de sus propios viajes, escucha las indicaciones de la voz de Dios para ser las manos de la misericordia para este hombre necesitado. Expresa más que una simple voluntad de ser interrumpido; Reconoce la dignidad inherente de este hombre por encima de cualquier estigmas, categorías, etiquetas o expectativas. Su escucha activa permite que la Palabra de Dios se arraiga en su corazón, y él demuestra su recepción a través de sus actos de caridad.

Escuchar la voz de Dios en oración implica la voluntad de ser conducido e interrumpido. Inspirado por el Espíritu Santo, la Palabra de Dios trasciende la capacidad de nuestras mentes y nos lleva a pensar de manera diferente sobre nuestras relaciones entre ellos. Nos motiva en nuestro propio amado para que podamos reconocer el amado de quienes nos rodean, dándonos la libertad de recibir, dar la bienvenida y aceptar.

En las próximas semanas, los miembros de nuestro Consejo Parroquial involucrarán a cada feligrés en breves conversaciones individuales en las que usted y los concejales escuchen escuchar cómo el Espíritu Santo está llamando a nuestra parroquia a la misión.
