A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Martha always gets a bad rap. In traditional interpretations of her story, she is said to be too preoccupied or anxious about the details of hospitality to attend well to her guest. Her sister, by contrast, sits in rapt attention at Jesus's feet, drinking in his every word. When Jesus declares that it is Mary who has "chosen the better part," the message we are supposed to take away, according to many commentators, is that contemplative rather than active service is the harder but better choice and that no one can minister without first sitting and learning at Jesus's feet.

Recently New Testament scholars have proposed that Luke's concern in telling this story may be different than that. They have noticed that what concerns Martha is much "diakonia," and her distress is over her sister leaving her to carry it out alone. Elsewhere in the New Testament, this term refers primarily to ministerial service. And the term "diakonia" is part of a controversy swirling about what women would do- in ministerial service- with what they learned while sitting at Jesus's feet.

The answer Luke gave was quite understandable for his time. Today's gospel invites us to reflect on what answer Jesus might give today to the question of a woman's place in the ministries of the church as they have now evolved. And this is also an ongoing topic of discussion in the synodal discussions that occurred between 2021 and 2024 and will surely continue thereafter.

Saint of the Day: Saint Mary Magdelen July 22 Very little solid information about Saint Mary, and both scholars and traditions differ on the interpretation. She was a friend and follower of Jesus. Filled with sorrow over her sin, she anointed Christ, washed his feet with her hair. He exorcised seven demons from her. She was visited by the Risen Christ. There are also

arguments about her life after the Crucifixion. The Greek Church maintains that she retired to Ephesus with the Blessed Virgin Mary and lived there the rest of her life. A French tradition says that Mary, Lazarus, and others came to Marseilles, France evangelized and converted the whole Provence region, then retired to live 30 years as a penitent hermitess at La Sainte-Baume. Some things we do know for certain: Mary was not Jesus' wife or mistress, the mother of His child, she did not found a royal dynasty or separate branch of Christianity, et cetera, et cetera, ad nauseam. Died: Greek Church says she died in Ephesus of natural causes and her relics were transferred to Constantinople in 886 where they remain today. A French tradition says as she lay on her death bed, nine angles carried Mary to the oratory of Saint Maximinus in Aix where she received Communion and then died of natural causes. She was interred in an oratory constructed by Saint Maximinus at Villa Lata (Saint Maximin) in 745 her relics were moved to Vézelay to save them from Saracen invaders and at some point they were moved to a shrine at her hermitage on La Sainte-Baume: they were there in 1279 when King Charles II of Naples funded a Dominican convent on the hill in 1600 the relics were placed in a sarcophagus sent by Pope Clement VIII in 1814, the church on La Sainte-Baume, wrecked during the anti-Christian excesses of the French Revolution, was restored and in 1822; grotto was re-consecrated, still has the head of the saint. Canonized: Pre-Congregation

Pause and Pray: Rupture and Repair

Reflect Whenever we have serious conflict in our relationships with family, friends, or coworkers, it's tempting to demonize the other person or even sever the relationship. Even in the best relationships, however, there are moments of rupture. The messy work of love and redemption is to find ways to heal, repair, and deepen our connections with each other. Pray Lord, We know that death and resurrection are the pattern of all things that matter. In moments when we are angry, hurt, or estranged, may we have the strength to be vulnerable, to soften rather than harden our hearts. Give us the grace we need to give grace to others, so our love and care can lead to new life and deeper love. Act When you have gotten sideways with someone you love, don't expect them to make the first move toward reconciliation—even if you think the conflict is their fault. Without papering over hard things, find a way to tell and show them that you value the relationship and are willing to find ways to come back together. Unless there is abuse, try never to close the door on the possibility for a renewed relationship.

Información de comunidad Español

Martha siempre tiene una mala reputación. En las interpretaciones tradicionales de su historia, se dice que está demasiado preocupada o ansiosa por los detalles de la hospitalidad para asistir bien a su invitado. Su hermana, por el contrario, se sienta en la atención de los pies de Jesús, bebiendo en cada una de sus palabras. Cuando Jesús declara que es María la que ha "elegido la mejor parte", el mensaje que se supone que debemos quitar, según muchos comentaristas, es que el servicio contemplativo en lugar de activo es la opción más difícil pero mejor y que nadie puede ministrar sin sentarse primero y aprender a los pies de Jesús.

Recientemente, los estudiosos del Nuevo Testamento han propuesto que la preocupación de Luke al contar esta historia puede ser diferente a eso. Han notado que lo que se refiere a Martha es mucho "dikonia", y su angustia es que su hermana la dejó para llevarlo a cabo solo. En otra parte del Nuevo Testamento, este término se refiere principalmente al servicio ministerial. Y el término "dikonía" es parte de una controversia que se arremolina sobre lo que harían las mujeres, en el servicio ministerial, con lo que aprendieron mientras estaban sentados a los pies de Jesús.

La respuesta que dio Luke fue bastante comprensible para su tiempo. El evangelio de hoy nos invita a reflexionar sobre qué respuesta Jesús podría dar hoy a la pregunta del lugar de una mujer en los ministerios de la Iglesia, ya que ahora han evolucionado. Y este también es un tema de discusión en curso en las discusiones sinodales que ocurrieron entre 2021 y 2024 y seguramente continuará a partir de entonces.
