A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Many of us have likely struggled with understanding the ways in which God answers prayer. This is a common experience, and the good news today is that our Sacred Scriptures show us that this is a deeply human experience throughout all of time.. Those who have put their trust in God have felt this longing or frustration or confusion again and again.

Some of us feel like we have to bargain with God in order to receive his favors. But we don't have to convince God to be generous to us----that is the very thing God wants to do! Jesus tells the parable in today's gospel about a person who goes to a friend late at night asking for bread because of an unexpected visitor to whom he has little to offer in the way of hospitality. Through persistence even more than friendship- and even the shame that would beset the non-giver- the person gives whatever is asked. If that is true of humans, how much more is that true of God.

In the opening lines of the gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray, showing them how to begin by centering on God's holiness, God's realm, and God's bountiful gifts of daily food and forgiveness. By accepting these unearned and abundant gifts, disciples are transformed into people who are increasingly giving and forgiving, like God. The persistence needed is not to keep imploring God so as to change God's mind, but to keep on faithfully praying so as to be changed into an icon of divine generosity.

Saint of the Day: Saint Ignatius of Loyola July 31 Born to the Spanish nobility. Youngest of 12, Page in the Spanish court of Ferdinand and Isabella. Military education. Soldier, entered the army in 1517, and served several campaigns. Wounded in the leg by a cannonball at the siege of Pampeluna on 20 May 1521, an injury that left him partially crippled for life. During his recuperation the only books he had access to were The Golden Legend, a collection of biographies of the saints, and the Life of Christ by

Ludolph the Carthusian. These books, and the time spent in contemplation, changed him. On his recovery he took a vow of chastity, hung his sword before the altar of the Virgin of Montserrat, and donned a pilgrim's robes. He lived in a cave from 1522 to 1523, contemplating the way to live a Chistian life. Pilgram to Rome and the Holy Land in 1523, where he worked to convert Muslim. In 1528 he began studying Theology in Barcelona and Alcala, Spain and Paris, France receiving his degree on 14 March 1534. His Meditations/ prayers/visions and insights led to forming the Constitutions of the Society of Jesus on 15 August 1534; it received papal approval in 1541. Friend of James Lainez, Alonso Salmerón, Nicholas Bobadilla, Simón Rodriguez, Blessed Peter Faber, and Saint Francis Xavier, the group that formed the core of the new Society. He never used the term Jesuit, which was coined as an insult by his opponents; the Society today uses the term with pride. Travelled to Europe and the Holy Lands, settled in in Rome to direct the Jesuits. His health suffered in later years, and he was nearly blind at death. The Jesuits have over 500 universities and colleges, 30,000 members, and teach over 200,000 students a year. Born 1491 at Loyola, Guipuzcoa, Spain as Inigo Lopez de Loyola Died 31 July 1556 at Rome, Italy of fever Beatified 27 July 1609 by Pope Paul V Canonized 12 arch 1622 by Pope Gregory XV

Pause and Pray:

Reflect: It's understandable why we fear hospitals, for ourselves, and our loved ones. But at some point, we all end up there. Think back to when you were in the hospital: taking someone to the ER or having a surgery yourself. As scary as this can be, and even if the outcome was heartbreaking, can you see how God's healing presence was there? Pray: You, God, are not just in the hospital chapel, but in the long, sterile hallways, the fluorescent lights, the waiting rooms alongside strangers. You are in the hands of the surgeons and nurses using their gifts to heal. You are in the fragments of prayers we murmur while we wait. As we suffer. It feels so strange to discover you here, and yet, of course you are here! When fear strips everything away we find you again in the places we need you the most. Act: Take time to acknowledge a doctor, nurse, or medical assistant who was there for you or a loved one. A card, a text, even a positive review online, to honor those who, as St. Theresa of Avila says, are "Christ's hands on earth."

En las primeras líneas del evangelio, Jesús enseña a sus discípulos a rezar, mostrándoles cómo comenzar centrándose en la santidad de Dios, el reino de Dios y los abundantes dones de la comida diaria y el perdón diario. Al aceptar estos regalos no ganados y abundantes, los discípulos se transforman en personas que son cada vez más dando y perdonadoras, como Dios.
