A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Today's liturgy dares us to be sheep among wolves, to be evangelizers in a world dying for lack of love. The wolves of our time are purveyors of fear and hatred that spawn every type of bigotry, division, violence and lies. Pope Leo XIV tells us that as disciples. we are sent into "many settings in which the Christian" faith is considered absurd, meant for the weak and unintelligent. Settings where other securities are preferred, like technology, money, success, power or pleasure . . . where believers are mocked, opposed, despised or at best tolerated and pitied." What do we have to offer? Like the inexpert 72, we got nothing more than our experience of the joy of living Christ's message. As disciples, we can continue to share experiences of love, hope and possibility that are strong enough to seduce others into believing the unbelievable: that the reign of God is at hand. If we want to succeed in taking up Jesus' mission, we will draw people through attraction rather than rational proof. We need to know our faith by heart and accept the fact that what we offer will only attract the hungry; the complacent know how to stay safe behind what old toothpaste ads called "an invisible protective shield." As Pope Leo points out, they prefer the kind of securities they can buy or demand. They are tragically out of touch with their deepest yearnings, invulnerable to knowing the vastness of God's love.

Saint of the Day: Saint Thomas July 3



St. Thomas was called to be one of the twelve Apostles. He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. When Jesus said He was returning to Judea to visit His sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately exhorted the other Apostles to accompany Him on the trip. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the

Way, the Truth, and the Life. St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas." St. Thomas is believed to have brought the gospel to India. He built seven churches in India and was martyred during prayer near Madras. His remains were later transported to Ortona, Italy, but many of his relics still reside in India.

Pause and Pray:

Prayer is Born from Love...What causes this dryness in our prayer?

Some may relate it to a period of grief after a loved one dies suddenly or too young, while others may look to a period following a job loss or unexpected move. Having a mental illness like depression may make prayer difficult. For many of us, these periods just happen. It is important to remember you are still praying, even though you may not feel peace and comfort. Putting the effort in prayer is a sacrifice we make and God accepts it.

Prayer is a relationship with God. Relationships take time and are based on love. In our friendships and marriages there are times when we hear "I love you." There are also times when the love is there, but more silent to our expectations. Freeing Ourselves From Hurt... Reflect: When we are hurt by someone, it's not easy to let that pain go. Forgiveness seems like too big a step to take. But by letting go of the hurt, we are actually freeing ourselves to heal from the hurt. Pray: Dear God, give me the strength to release my hurt and anger and have the courage to travel the path to forgiveness. I know it won't be an easy path so I ask you to walk by my side. Amen. Act: Offer the gift of forgiveness to someone who has hurt you. If you're not able to do so in person, do so in your heart.
