A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Faith rooted in experience is at the heart of our faith. First there was Abraham, our father in faith. Abraham trusted God and left his home in obedience. He began to receive what was promised, the realization of what he hoped for. Generations later Abraham's descendants, the Israelites, knew how God provided for Abraham, trusted in God and had the courage to wait to see his justice.

Christ's disciples, even though the land promised to them was under Roman occupation, had the privilege of seeing and knowing the Messiah, fully realizing what generations had hoped for. Jesus assured them that they could be confident in God's desire to fulfill his promises to them- "Do not be afraid little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." As God provided for Abraham, the Israelites, and the disciples, we can trust him to provide for us. We can be like vigilant servants, ever ready for the realization of what we hope for.

Today's gospel comes to us in the middle of Ordinary Time, but it is strongly reminiscent of the Advent season. The enjoinders to remain vigilant and prepared echo the readings we hear in December. It is timely in a sense, as this long stretch of Ordinary Time is one where we might be tempted toward passivity. But it is a time meant for growth, engagement and attentiveness. Let us commit to the alertness of Advent, the gratitude of Christmas, the repentance of Lent and the joy of Easter.

Saint of the Day: St. Pius X, Pope August 21 Son of Giambattista Sarto, a cobbler, and Margherita Sanson, living in poverty as one of eight children. Baptized in 1835. Confirmed in 1848. He early felt a calling to the priesthood. Studied at the seminary of Pauda, Italy, and was an exceptional student. Ordained by Blessed Giovanni Antonio Farina in 1858. Chaplin at Tombolo from 1858-67. Arch priest of Salzano

from 1867-75. Canon of the Treviso cathedral chapter in1875. Rector of the Treviso seminary and spiritual director for 9 years. Primicerius of the cathedral in 1879. Chancellor of diocese of Treviso. Vicar capitular from December 1879-80. Bishop of Mantua, Italy November 1884. Assistant at the Pontifical Throne 19 June 1891. Cardinalpriest of Saint Bernardo alle Terme June 1893. Patriarch of Venice June 1893. Chosen 257th pope in 1903, taking the name *Pius X*. Issued decrees on early Communion (age 7 instead of 12/14). Destroyed the last vestiges of Jansenism by advocating frequent and even daily Communion. Reformed the liturgy, promoted clear and simple homilies, and brought Gregorian chant back to services. Revised the Breviary, and teaching of the Catechism. Fought Modernism, which he denounced as "the summation of all heresies". Reorganized the Roman curia, and the other administrative elements of the Church. Worked against the modern antagonism of the state against the Church, Initiated the codification of canon law, Promoting Bible reading by all the faithful. Supported foreign missions. His will read: "I was born poor; I lived poor; I wish to die poor."

Meditation: God Is Near, Trustworthy, and Good
What if Martha paused to breathe a prayer of gratitude, so that the sound escaping from her lips in that moment of pause had been a contented sigh rather than agitation? What if she was filled with grace and with the presence of Jesus? This is what Jesus desires to invite us into: a contentment that is not dependent on who we are but on who he is. Contentment is a theme throughout the Bible. St. Paul professed, "I have learned to be content with whatever I have." Comenzó a recibir lo que se prometió, la realización de lo que esperaba. Las generaciones más tarde los descendientes de Abraham, los israelitas, sabían cómo Dios proporcionaba a Abraham, confiaba en Dios y tenía el coraje de esperar para ver su justicia.

Los discípulos de Cristo, a pesar de que la tierra les prometió estaba bajo ocupación romana, tuvieron el privilegio de ver y conocer al Mesías, al darse cuenta de lo que las generaciones esperaban. Jesús les aseguró que podrían tener confianza en el deseo de Dios de cumplir sus promesas a ellos: "No tengas miedo de la pequeña rebaño, porque tu Padre se complace en darte el reino".
