A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

Hospitality and humility, two central themes that emerge from this Sunday's readings, are two virtues that need to be recovered for the full flourishing of life on the planet. The Book of Sirach says "to humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and the more you will find favor with God." Humility involves recognizing our strengths and weaknesses, appreciating the gifts and talents of others and respecting others' views and perspectives, and it fosters individual and communal health. These themes are also central to our upcoming parishioner conversations "in the Spirit."

Luke's Gospel invites us to focus on the leadership styles of all the sociopolitical boardroom tables that set in motion decisions for our global world. The disenfranchised and those who struggle have neither a place nor voice at the table, and the meal served, the policies made, nourish only a few. The psalm celebrates the Holy One of Israel whose hospitality of heart cares for both the human and the nonhuman, the poor, the widow, the orphan, the disenfranchised and even the languishing earth. One has only to look at how many world leaders conduct their affairs in their quest for superiority and supremacy to see this global corruption of heart, mind and soul.

Sweeping cuts to Medicaid are occurring in the United States, global poverty is increasing in the form of limited or no food and education access, unclean drinking water, growing economic inequality, dislocation caused by raging wars and the continued loss of habitat and food sources for our nonhuman neighbors all indicate the absence of hospitality. A hospitality of heart that embodies divine love is badly needed to recognize "the other" as our own and to create new tables that empathize, welcome and accommodate all.

Saint of the Day: St. Peter Claver September 9

Farmer's son. Studied at the University of Barcelona. Jesuit from age 20. Priest. Influenced by Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez to become a missionary in America. Ministered, physically and spiritually, to slaves when they arrived in Cartegena, converting a reported 300,000, and working for humane treatment on the plantations for 40 years. Organized charitable societies among the Spanish America similar to those organized in Europe by Saint Vincent de Paul.

Born: 25 June 1581 at Verdu, Catalonia, Spain Died: 8 September 1654 at Cartegena, Colombia of natural causes

Beatified: 16 July 1850 by Pope Blessed Pius

Canonized: 15 January 1888 by Pope Leo XIII

Meditation: Finding God On the Road One morning, we began walking at around 7:30. My body felt good, and I was walking at a fairly quick clip. Then, seemingly out of nowhere, a couple of pilgrims took the inside of a sharp curve and blew right past me. I hadn't even seen them coming. I actually got frustrated that I had been passed. I decided that I needed to walk faster and take the lead once again. There was no way that I was going to get passed. It was not long before I was forced to accept defeat. Those other people had won. Why did it bother me? I was on a pilgrimage, not in a race. This was not a competition. Had I made it one? Perhaps deep inside of me, a part of me that I was embarrassed about, I had made it into a competition. I felt God telling me that it did not matter if I finished first: it wasn't about winning. All that mattered was that I was walking and that I would finish. Another day on the Camino. Another day closer to God. —from St. Anthony Messenger's "Finding God on the Camino" by Fr. Pause and Pray: Embrace the Quiet Reflect: We are surrounded by so much noise on a daily basis. Some of it is unavoidable, some of it is self-imposed. At times, it's almost as if we're afraid of the quiet, afraid of sitting alone with ourselves without some sort of distraction. Pray: Lord, help us rediscover the beauty of stillness and quiet. Remind us that sometimes when we shut out the noise and sit with ourselves and our thoughts, we can discover great beauty. Inspire us to go inward and remember that silence and all that we can find in it is a gift and a blessing. Act: Sit in silence for five minutes and focus on your breathing.

El salmo celebra al Santo de Israel, cuya hospitalidad de corazón cuida tanto a los humanos como a los no humanos, a los pobres, a las viudas, a los huérfanos, a los marginados e incluso a la tierra languideciente. Uno solo tiene que mirar cuántos líderes mundiales conducen sus asuntos en su búsqueda de superioridad y supremacía para ver esta corrupción global de corazón, mente y alma.
