The Diocese is committed to maintain an active and highly visible Catholic presence in these counties by walking alongside our sister parishes and missions that need support to serve their local communities. Funds raised are used to stock our pantry and provide assistance to residents of Clark County. It is not to late to make a donation. Thank you for your generosity and support.



Saint of the Day: St. Jerome September 30 Born to a rich pagan family, Jerome led a wild and misspent youth. Became a lawyer. Converted and joined the Church, was baptized in 365, studied theology and had a true conversion He became a monk, needing isolation for his study of Scripture he lived as a hermit in the Syrian deserts. Is reported to have drawn a thorn from a lion's paw; the animal stayed loyally at his side for years. Priest. Student

of Saint Gregory of Nazianzen. Secretary to Pope Damasus I who commissioned Jerome to revise the Latin text of the Bible. The result of 30 years is the *Vulgate* translation, the standard Latin version for over a millenia, still in use today. Friend/Teacher of Sts Paula, Marcella and Eustochium an association that led to gossip and Jerome left Rome to return to desert solitude. Lived his last 34 years in the Holy Land as a semi-recluse, writing and translating works of history, biography, the writings of Origen, and more.

Minute Meditation: The Larks of Assisi The larks are birds that love the light and shun the darkness. But on the night that St. Francis went to Christ, they came to the roof of the house, though already the twilight of the night to follow had fallen, and they flew about the house amid a great clamor, whether to show their joy or their sadness in their own way by their singing, we do not know. Tearful rejoicing and joyful sorrow made up their song, either to bemoan the fact that they were orphaned children, or to announce that their father was going to his eternal glory. The watchmen who guarded the place, were filled with astonishment and called the others to witness the wonder. (Celano, Treatise on the Miracles of Blessed Francis, 32) Francis had a special affection for larks; he considered their brown feathers a sign of their closeness to God, of their humility. Thus, it was only fitting that larks should take notice of Francis's death—at twilight, an hour when they are not usually flying around. The harmony of all creation that Francis represented while alive did not end at death. Francis died on the plain below Assisi. The larks' movement attracted the attention of Assisi's watchmen, a thirty-minute walk up the hill. The larks still swirl through the twilight in Assisi. —from Peace and Good: Through the Year with Francis of Assisi by Pat McCloskey, OFM

Pause and Pray: When Joy Swims Reflect: Like many who follow Francis, I've read "Canticle of the Creatures" over the years, but recently sought it out again for the words "to you alone, Most High, do they belong". While visiting with friends on a beach in New Jersey, I saw a strange shape, thinking it was the waves receding. But it was a whale on the shore, enormous, swimming left to right! It kept surfacing and disappearing as a white fountain of water sprayed. Everyone on the beach was shouting and pointing with joy. Reflect: On a life event where a miracle of nature restored your sense of wonder, connecting you to God. Pray: Today, front and center in our hearts, let us hold God's miracles of the earth arising when we have least expected them. Let us trust that they are always there, often unknown and invisible. We wait. We watch. We long to see them. And then in all their splendor they suddenly appear. Act: Take time to reread "Canticle of the Creatures." This life-giving poem never fails to renew.
