A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

After last Sunday's remarkable confession of my email to the Bishop, today's Gospel warning, of not sitting down and calculating the cost before doing so, struck home with real impact. Indeed I did not calculate if I had enough wisdom to complete what my email had offered the Bishop, namely my retirement as pastor. The Bishop, inevitably kind and wise, offered me a meeting to discuss our shared options. As I write this- last Monday, I don't know what that meeting has resolved; but I trust God's good graces will have prevailed.

Many who have undertaken a path of doing great things for God- in my case, a request of being a pastor in the Lexington Diocese- have realized that doing so is one thing but honoring it is quite another. Such a scene confronts us in today's Gospel. God's call to hate life, family and possessions goes against our natural instincts. I know, however, that these attachments can not take priority over our attachment to Jesus.

As Jesus' blood kin can also be disciples, so can our families. But as Jesus asks, they must be willing to embrace as kin others not related by blood, who are different by whatever markers that potentially can cause tension and even rupture in one's biological family. A disciple needs to be forewarned of this difficulty and be prepared to confront it. As Paul implores Philemon, we must embrace our non-biological siblings as family and equals. Let us then build up our resources to accomplish the great things to which God has called us.



Saint of the Day: St. John Chrysostom September 13

John's father died when he was young, and he was raised by a very pious mother. Well educated; studied rhetoric under Libanius, one of the most famous orators of his day. Monk. Preacher and priest for a dozen years in Syria. While there he developed a stomach ailment that troubled him the rest of his life. It was for his sermons that John earned the title Chrysostom = golden mouthed. They were always on point, they explained the Scriptures with clarity, and they sometimes went on for hours. Made a reluctant bishop of Constantinople in 398, a move that involved him in imperial politics. He criticized the rich for

not sharing their wealth, fought to reform the clergy, prevented the sale of ecclesiastical offices, called for fidelity in marriage, encouraged practices of justice and charity. Archbishop and Patriarch of Constantinople. Revised the Greek Liturgy. Because John's sermons advocated a change in their lives, some nobles and bishops worked to remove him from his diocese; he was twice exiled from his diocese. Banished to Pythius, he died on the road. Greek Father of the Church. Proclaimed Doctor of the Church in 451. Born: c.347 at Antioch. Asia Minor Died: 407 of natural causes Canonized: Pre-Congregation

Minute Meditation: Doubt Can Benefit Us The word ponder means "to weigh." Do people need to weigh something about which they are absolutely certain? Does that describe the Virgin Mary's faith at every point of her life? Isn't it more likely that at the foot of Jesus' cross, Mary said to herself in her own way, The Lord is in this somewhere? Children understandably tend to take an either/or approach to life: faith or doubt? Adults who regularly choose a both/and approach can incorporate all of life's experiences into a growing faith. Después de la notable confesión del domingo pasado de mi email al obispo, la advertencia del Evangelio de hoy, de no sentarse y calcular el costo antes de hacerlo, golpeó con un impacto real. De hecho, no calculé si tenía suficiente sabiduría para completar lo que mi correo electrónico había ofrecido al obispo, es decir, mi retiro como párroco. El obispo, inevitablemente amable y sabio, me ofreció una reunión para discutir nuestras opciones compartidas. Mientras escribo esto, el lunes pasado, no sé qué ha resuelto esa reunión; pero confío en que la buena voluntad de Dios habrá prevalecido.

Muchos de los que han emprendido un camino de hacer grandes cosas para Dios, en mi caso, una solicitud de ser pastor en la Diócesis de Lexington, se han dado cuenta de que hacerlo es una cosa, pero honrarlo es otra muy distinta. Tal escena nos confronta en el Evangelio de hoy. El llamado de Dios a odiar la vida, la familia y las posesiones va en contra de nuestros instintos naturales. Sé, sin embargo, que estos apegos no pueden tener prioridad sobre nuestro apego a Jesús.

Así como los parientes de sangre de Jesús también pueden ser discípulos, también pueden hacerlo nuestras familias. Pero como Jesús pide, deben estar dispuestos a abrazar como parientes a otros no relacionados por sangre, que son diferentes por cualquier marcador que potencialmente pueda causar tensión e incluso ruptura en la familia biológica de uno. Un discípulo necesita ser advertido de esta dificultad y estar preparado para enfrentarla. Como Pablo implora a Filemón, debemos abrazar a nuestros hermanos no biológicos como familia e iguales. Construyamos entonces nuestros recursos para lograr las grandes cosas a las que Dios nos ha llamado.
