A Note From Fr. Jim Kinney

This is a very busy weekend- Halloween, All Saints and All souls being celebrated together. The Beatitudes speak to the blessings forthcoming to those who adhere to the parameters contained therein while all souls trust in God's mercy and Jesus' promise to raise up those entrusted to him. In both cases the joy of knowing God's incomparable love for all his children prevails, for saint and sinner alike.

Both solemnities point to the radical truth of the incarnation: "God became man so that man might become like God." Properly understood, the saints provide all the more reason we need to celebrate the love of Christ poured out for us. God is not an impartial judge, even as saints inherit a special place in the life of the Church. But one enters heaven without being perfectly purified of sin. As saints are celebrated publicly, no soul entering heaven is loved any less by God. All have taken up their cross and enjoy eternal life. Life, indeed, is changed, not ended.

As we call upon and venerate the saints who are formally canonized and recognized by the church, we also acknowledge those souls in heaven known only to God. They too surround us and celebrate the divine liturgy with us. As we imitate their virtue and ask for their intercession, we pray that we might live out our baptismal call and one day join their ranks. Let us thank God for drawing all of us to himself and to the holiness we seek.

Saint of the Day: St. Charles **Borromeo November 4**

Born to a wealthy noble family, third of six children, son of Count Giberto II Borromeo and Margherita de' Medici. Nephew of Pope Pius IV. Suffered with a speech impediment. Studied in Milan. and at The University of Pavia, studying at one point under the future Pope Gregory XIII. Civil and cannon lawver at age 21. Cleric at Milan, taking the habit on Created cardinal on 31 January 1560 at age 22. St. Charles

spent his life and fortune in the service of the people of his diocese. He directed and fervently enforced the decrees of the Council of Trent, fought tirelessly for peace in the wake of the storm caused by Martin Luther, founded schools for the poor, seminaries for clerics, hospitals for the sick, conducted synods, instituted children's Sunday school, did great public and private penance, and worked among the sick and dying, leading his people by example. Born: Wednesday 2 October 1538 in the castle at Aron, diocese of Novara, Italy Died: 3 November 1584 of a fever at Milan, Italy; his will named the Hospital Maggiore of Milan as his heir; buried in the metropolitan cathedral of Milan; relics transferred to a chapel built by Count Renato Borromeo in piazza San Maria Podone, Milan on 21 September 1751.

Ask A Franciscan: Can the obligation to attend Mass on holy days be fulfilled before or after the actual day? Likewise, can you fulfill the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday on some other day? Christmas fell on a Friday last year. Was there an obligation to attend Mass the following Sunday? Someone told me that attending Mass that Friday already fulfilled the Sunday obligation. I disagreed.

The obligation to attend Mass on a holy day is separate from the obligation for Sunday. If Christmas falls on a Saturday, there is one obligation for that holy day and a separate one for the next day. Attending a late afternoon or evening Mass the day before the holy day or on Saturday fulfills these obligations. There is no window, a couple days beforehand or afterward. Bishops can transfer some holy days to the nearest Sunday, as is the case for the Feast of Ascension in most of the United States. My answer assumes that the person can attend Mass on these days without great hardship. If a priest is responsible for several parishes or missions, it might be physically impossible to celebrate the Eucharist in each one on every holy day or Sunday. If a person were so sick that he or she could not leave the house, then the obligation would not apply during that illness. But you did not indicate that was the case in the situation that you described. Father Pat McCloskey, OFM

Así como los santos son celebrados públicamente, ninguna alma que entra al cielo es amada menos por Dios. Todos han tomado su cruz y gozan de la vida eterna. La vida, en verdad, cambia, no termina.

Al invocar y venerar a los santos que han sido formalmente canonizados y reconocidos por la iglesia, también reconocemos a aquellas almas en el cielo que sólo Dios conoce. Ellas también nos rodean y celebran la liturgia divina con nosotros. Al imitar su virtud y pedir su intercesión, oramos para vivir nuestro llamado bautismal y algún día unirnos a sus filas. Demos gracias a Dios por atraernos a todos hacia Él y Paz. Padre Jim hacia la santidad que buscamos.
